THE PASTOR'S CORNER:

RELATIONSHIP

A fully mature missionary disciple is a person who has a personal relationship with our Lord Jesus Christ. Relationship, this is the first characteristic or mark of a mature disciple, he is always ready to follow and imitate Christ.

The Gospel calls all of us disciples of the Lord to become the salt of the earth and the light of the world. Mature disciples give flavor and light to all the people around them.
