THE PASTOR'S CORNER:

WORSHIP

The Gospel tells us the story about the Transfiguration of our Lord Jesus Christ up the mountain. Peter, James and John were very fortunate to be with Jesus at that time, and they saw the face of Jesus shone like the sun and heard the voice of God, the Father. The disciples fell prostrate and worship God.

Going to church for the Sunday Mass to worship and pray to God, is like that experience of Peter, James and John up in the mountain. It feels like you would like to stay there, put up a tent and never come down the mountain. But the truth is, to be a mature missionary disciple of our Lord Jesus Christ, we all need to come down from that transfiguration experience and proclaim to all the people that the Son of Man died and rose from the dead.

In our Disciple Maker Index Survey, one of the questions was about our participation in the Liturgy or Celebration of Mass, Eucharistic Adoration, Catholic Devotions and other prayers like the Rosary.

However, a mature missionary disciple does not only participate in all these activities all the time, so much so that, he or she would like to stay in church most of the times. The DMI Survey also asked the questions, if we have invited someone to come to the Mass and if we have shared Jesus to others.

Therefore, a disciple of our Lord Jesus Christ should have a mature understanding that the Liturgy and the Sacraments are meant to be shared with others. As a mature disciple, we should not spend all our time kneeling at the altar but we should go out and do missions to proclaim, the love of God and the words of our Lord Jesus Christ.

All Fridays in Lent are mandatory days of abstaining from meat. Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are mandatory days of fasting and abstaining from meat. All Catholics who have reached the age of 14 are required by Church law to observe mandatory days of abstaining from meat. All Catholics who have reached the age of 18 are required by Church law to observe mandatory days of fasting, and are limited to one full meal without meat. This requirement ceases for an individual upon his/her 59th birthday (canon 1252).
