THE PASTOR'S CORNER:

MISSION TO SERVE

March 25th is the Feast of the Annunciation of the birth of our Lord Jesus Christ. The angel Gabriel announced to the Blessed Virgin Mary her mission to be the Mother of God and she said "Yes." Mary received a blessing and an honor but her focus was more on how to serve God and others, so she said, "I am the servant of the Lord. Be it done to me according to your word."

The Fourth Sunday of Lent is also called *Laetare* Sunday and it means "to rejoice." There is a reason for us to rejoice this weekend even though we are in the Season of Lent. After Mary said "Yes" to the angel the Messiah, who saved us from our sins, was conceived in her womb. As we come near to the celebration of the Paschal Mystery, that is, the Passion, Death and Resurrection of our Lord Jesus Christ, we will see the fulfillment of the "Yes" of Mary. It was a mission accomplished by the Blessed Virgin Mary, the first disciple of Jesus.

In the Gospel, there was the man born blind, who after he was healed by Jesus, he became an instant disciple of the Lord. When the Pharisees summoned this blind man healed by Jesus, the man preached to the Pharisees about being a disciple of Jesus. The parents of this healed blind man were afraid to even speak about the healing made by Jesus, but he was not afraid, and that is a mark of a mature missionary disciple. When this healed man met Jesus again, he boldly proclaimed that Jesus is Lord and he believed in Him.

Our mission as mature disciples of our Lord Jesus Christ is to say "Yes" to Him every day and to proclaim to all men and women that we are humble servants of the Lord and we are ready to give our life of service to God, to the Church and to others. As we continue with the Season of Lent and look forward to the Holy Week and Easter, let us pray and hope that grace of God will strengthen us and lead us to become mature missionary disciples of our Lord Jesus Christ.
