BREAKING OF THE BREAD

During the Last Supper of our Lord Jesus Christ, He broke the bread and said, "This is my Body." Then He took the cup with wine and said, "This is my Blood." After Jesus had broken the bread, He shared it to His apostles and after He took a drink from the cup, He commanded His apostles to remember and do this in memory of Him. Jesus Himself explained that whoever eats His Body and drinks His Blood will never die and they will have eternal life with Him in the kingdom of heaven.

In sadness and despair after the death of the Jesus on the cross, the apostles had forgotten what the Lord had commanded them to do. The two disciples walking to Emmaus were in that state of loneliness that they did not even recognize the Risen Lord walking along with them. But after the breaking of the bread, the two disciples remembered everything that the Lord had commanded them to do and so they walked back to Jerusalem that very night to tell the other disciples how the Lord reminded them about the breaking of the bread. The Risen Lord appeared to the apostles a few more times after that, and each time He appeared to them, He broke the bread once again and shared the cup to them.

How many times did we forget to go to Mass especially on Sundays and Holy Days of Obligation? Our Risen Lord will never forget us even if we sometimes do not remember Him. Now, Jesus is reminding us once again about His faithful love for us and the importance of sharing and breaking the bread with Him. Our Risen Lord Jesus Christ is knocking at the doors of hearts and He is inviting not only in the breaking of the bread in the Holy Mass but also at the eternal banquet He has prepared for us in the kingdom of heaven.

I would like to congratulate our CCD students who received their first holy communion last weekend, and I would like to thank their parents and family for bringing up their children to the church, especially in bringing them always to the celebration of the Holy Eucharist.

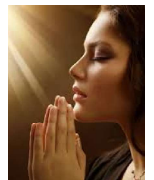
