THE PASTOR'S CORNER:

PASSION

We enter this weekend to the holiest week of the year and Jesus Himself entered Jerusalem to suffer, to be crucified and to die for the salvation of all men. Even though Jesus received a warm welcome from the people of Jerusalem, He knew what was going to happen to Him and He did not abort. Jesus stayed in Jerusalem and fulfilled the will of the Father by offering His life on the cross.

Unfortunately, the disciples of our Lord Jesus Christ abandoned and ran away from Him; for fear that they too will die on the cross. Peter showed courage by following Jesus but when he was confronted about being associated with Jesus, he denied Him three times. The disciples were too weak to understand everything that happened to Jesus and they will need the power of the Holy Spirit to strengthen them and become true and mature missionary disciples of our Lord Jesus Christ. However, after the Pentecost, these weak disciples of Jesus came out of hiding and went to all the nations, strengthened and determined to preach the Gospel and follow Jesus, even if it meant suffering and dying for Jesus.

After we have reflected on the different process and dimensions of discipleship in this Season of Lent, let us ask ourselves this question: Are we ready to follow Jesus?

I would like to invite you all to the celebration of the Holy Triduum of the Passion, Death and Resurrection of our Lord Jesus Christ. This coming Holy Thursday, April 13 at 7:00 p.m., we will have the commemoration of the Last Supper of Jesus with His disciples and the washing of the feet of the twelve apostles. On this day, Jesus instituted the Holy Eucharist or the Mass and commanded His disciples to celebrate the breaking of the bread in memory of Him. Following this we will have procession to the Community Center with Adoration until midnight. On Good Friday, April 14 at 8:00 a.m., we will have Morning Prayer, and at 3:00 p.m., we will venerate the cross to remember the death of our Lord Jesus Christ. On Holy Saturday, April 15 at 8:00 a.m., we will again have a Morning Prayer and at 8:00 p.m., we will have the celebration of the Easter Vigil and the Resurrection of our Lord Jesus Christ.

These three days are very important for us, because we are all disciples of Jesus. This is not the time to abandon Him or run away from Him just like what the first disciples did. We have now in us the Holy Spirit who gives us the strength and the courage to follow Jesus to the cross. Let us pray and hope that this Holy Week will bring us all the grace we need for us to become mature missionary disciples of our Lord Jesus Christ.
