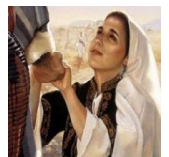

SPONSOR A CHILD FOR CCD

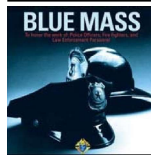
