THE PASTOR'S CORNER:

DISCERNING

"No one can serve two masters."

The Gospel reminds all of us, disciples of our Lord Jesus Christ, that we cannot serve both God and the world, at the same time. We will end up hating one and loving the other. Therefore as disciples we should learn to discern about our relationship with God and relationship with the things of this world.

Discerning is the fourth characteristic of a mature missionary disciple, and it means that a disciple should discern about communicating daily to God through prayer, and a disciple should make the relationship to God, grows and matures through the Holy Spirit. We are all disciples of our Lord Jesus Christ, and therefore, our discernment should always lead us to serving God alone and no other. Serving other masters is not an option, we should only serve God and love Him above all things.

As we prepare for the Season of Lent, this coming Ash Wednesday, we will have another opportunity to love God and hate sin, especially through the Sacrament of Reconciliation. We will put ashes on our foreheads because we admit before God that we are sinners, and we are in need of the forgiveness and mercy of our Lord Jesus Christ. It reminds us that we were made from the dust and we will return to dust someday. We are no masters and we need our true Master, Jesus, who will save us from our sinfulness.

Discernment helps the disciple to see all the weaknesses and shortcomings. Discernment also leads a disciple to follow every day the Will of God. A discerning disciple prays to receive the grace and the strength to become a faithful and mature disciple of the Master, our Lord Jesus Christ. Without discernment, it is impossible to grow and mature as a missionary disciple of Christ.

FASTING AND ABSTINENCE DURING LENT

All Fridays in Lent are mandatory days of abstaining from meat. Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are mandatory days of <u>fasting</u> and <u>abstaining</u> from meat. All Catholics who have reached the age of 14 are required by Church law to observe mandatory days of abstaining from meat. All Catholics who have reached the age of 18 are required by Church law to observe mandatory days of fasting, and are limited to one full meal without meat. This requirement ceases for an individual upon his/her 59th birthday (canon 1252).
