THE PASTOR'S CORNER:

EVANGELIZATION

There are people today who give themselves the title evangelist because of their work of preaching or because of their knowledge of the scriptures. Our Lord Jesus Christ was not just a simple evangelist who preached or studied the scriptures; He just simply said the word and everything came to be because He is truly the Word of God.

The Gospel tells us of the story of Lazarus, the friend of Jesus, who died and after four days Jesus came to the tomb and said the word, "Lazarus, come out," and Lazarus came back from the dead. This was not just Jesus, simply showing mercy and love for Lazarus, Martha and Mary, but this was Jesus showing to the people the glory of God, so much so that, many Jews from Jerusalem who witnessed what had happened began to believe and follow Jesus.

As disciples of our Lord Jesus Christ, we are all called to evangelize or share the Word of God to others. Some of us will say that we are not good at public speaking or even afraid to stand in front of other people. But if we believe in the power of the Word of God, we will not be the one speaking to the people and it will be the Holy Spirit through our lips that we will be able to proclaim the teachings of our Lord Jesus Christ.

The first apostles and disciples were also afraid of public speaking and could not understand the words of the scriptures, but when the Holy Spirit came down upon them on the Pentecost, they went out preaching and they were speaking in different languages. They were not afraid of anything anymore, and they preached everywhere following the command of our Lord Jesus Christ to go to all the nations to proclaim the Good News of our salvation. Nothing could stop the disciples from speaking of the words of our Lord Jesus Christ, even the threat of crucifixion and death because they have seen not only Lazarus coming back from the dead but they have seen Jesus Himself rose from the dead and ascended to the kingdom of heaven.

As we prepare for the Holy Week and recall the passion, death and resurrection of our Lord Jesus Christ, let us pray to the Holy Spirit to strengthen us as missionary disciples of the Lord. It is time for us to come out and preach everywhere the mercy and love of our Risen Lord Jesus Christ.
